



THE COVENANT OF FAITH

Grace College and Grace Theological Seminary
Affirming Biblical Truth and God's Word

The Covenant of Faith at Grace College and Seminary is expressed in the following statements:

- 1. We believe in THE HOLY SCRIPTURES:** accepting fully the Word of God, Old and New Testaments as the very Word of God, verbally inspired in all parts and therefore without error as originally given by God, also sufficiently clear in themselves, easily infallible in true faith and practice (Matt. 5:18; 24:35; 25:46; John 10:35; 17:18; 2 Cor. 3:18; 2 Tim. 3:16; 2 Pet. 1:21).
- 2. We believe in THE ONE TRINITY:** God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, three persons in one substance, one spirit and sovereign (Mark 1:10; 14:33; John 4:24; 14:3; 15:6; Ps. 135:6); perfect, infinite, almighty, eternal, in His infiniteness love, wisdom and power (Ps. 18:30, 147:5; 1 Thess. 3:13; Deut. 33:27). The Son became man, the God-man, Creator, at the command of His Father in the world to uphold and fulfill them (Gen. 1:1-2; 10:4); self-existent and self-revealing in three persons (Matt. 28:19; 1 Cor. 8:6; 2 Cor. 3:18; 10:13; John 1:3; Matt. 28:10; 2 Cor. 13:14); each of whom is to be honored and adored and worshiped equally as true God (Col. 1:16; 1 Cor. 8:5; 1 Thess. 5:3; 1 Tim. 2:5).
- 3. We believe in THE PERSON OF CHRIST:** the eternal Word and only begotten Son, our great God and Savior (John 1:1; 1:14; Titus 2:13; Rom. 10:9; 1 Cor. 15:45), without any second nature, to be blotted out of existence, He became man by the miracle of virgin birth (Gal. 4:14; 1 Tim. 1:15; Matt. 1:23). He is both God and man, as both true God and true Man, one Person with two natures (Col. 2:9; Rev. 1:18). Just as man, He was in all points tempted and liable as we are, yet without sin (Heb. 4:15; 1 Cor. 15:45). As the perfect Lamb of God He gave Himself in death upon both the cross and the tree, bearing the sin of the world, and suffering its full penalty of divine wrath (Isa. 53:5-6; 1 Cor. 15:3; 2 Cor. 5:21; 1 Pet. 3:13; 1 John 1:23); thereupon arose again from the dead and was glorified into heaven, the body in which He had suffered glorified (Rom. 24:17; 1 Cor. 15:20). That is our great High Priest and Intercessor (Heb. 4:14; 9:24; 1 John 2:1).

4. We believe in THE HOLY TRINITY. The three Persons of the triune God (Matt. 28:19)

Acts 5:3-4) the divine Agent in creation, revelation, and redemption (Gen. 1:12; Ps. 121:7-8; Cor. 2:15; 2 Cor. 7:13); and He convicts the world of sin (John 16:8-11), regenerates those who believe (John 3:5), baptizes (baptizes, seals, empowers, guides, teaches), sanctifies all who become children of God through Christ (1 Cor. 6:19; 1 Cor. 12:13, 14, 30; 1 Cor. 10:31; Rom 8:14; John 14:26; 1 Cor. 6:11).

5. We believe in THE CREATION AND FALL OF MAN that he was the direct work of God, spirit and soul and body, not merely the product of an unimpeachable ancestry, but made in the divine image. In this image man was created upright, innocent, and in personal disobedience to the reverent will of God, man became a sinful creature and the progenitor of a fallen race (Gen. 3:1-24; 5:5), who since then has continued in his practice (Eph. 2:3; Rom. 7:8; 5:12-19), alienated from the true and holy God (John 8:42-44), under whose judgment he stands (Gen. 3:17-19; Gen. 9:12-16; Rom. 1:18-21; Rom. 7:10).

6. We believe in SALVATION. the saving grace of God (Rom. 3:24-26; 6:13), neither trifling nor despising, but fearing and clinging to every virtue or work of man (Titus 2:12; Rom. 1:4-5; 11:11-12; 15:13-14), but above all else, the salvation of Jesus Christ (John 3:16-26; 2 Cor. 5:19; Titus 2:11-14), to whom all true believers as a present possession the gift of eternal life, a perfect inheritance, the love and favor of God, heavenly grace and security from all evil; and moreover, upon every spirit born again for life and godliness, and the divine guarantee that they shall never perish (Rom. 8:37-39; 1 Cor. 15:54; 2 Cor. 5:17-18; 1 Thess. 5:23-25), that the salvation includes the victory over Satan (1 John 5:4; 1 Cor. 15:54; 1 Thess. 5:23-25); and apart from Christ there is no possible salvation (Acts 4:12).

7. We believe in THE GOSPEL. the saving cause of salvation in every sense, but as the prop. spec. exercises of faith (Rom. 10:9; 1 Cor. 12:31; 2 Cor. 10:17; 1 Thess. 5:18; 1 Peter 1:23; 2 Cor. 4:12), and therefore as Christians who should keep the Word of God (Col. 2:6-7; 1 John 1:2-3; 1 Cor. 2:1-2; 2 Cor. 10:17), those which are above it (1 Tim. 5:10). Walk as He walked (1 John 2:6). As far as possible, in the spirit of Christ, in the power of the Spirit, with our solemn responsibility the duty and privilege of bearing the Gospel to the world, in order that all men may be saved (1 Tim. 2:4; 1 Cor. 9:22; 2 Cor. 5:11; 1 Tim. 1:15-16), that we may be victoriously and fruitfully engaged in the cause of God, not under law but under grace (Rom. 6:14), and who in drafting the gospel, are unworthy undeserved mercies of God and His present protection (Rom. 12:1-2; 1 Cor. 4:7; 1 Cor. 12:1-2; 1 Cor. 12:1-2).

8. We believe in THE EXISTENCE OF SATAN. Who originally was created a holy archangel and perfect being, but through pride and unlawful ambition revolved against God (Rev. 12:9-17; 28:13-17; Isa. 14:13-14; 1 Tim. 3:7-8). An accuser and murderer (Rev. 12:10), an eneyer in character (John 8:44), the greatest adversary of God and His people (Matt. 12:24-28; 25:41; 1 Cor. 11:15; 1 Tim. 2:15; 2 Cor. 11:15), and the prince of darkness (Rev. 12:9, 12; 13:1, 2; 16:14; 18:2, 3; 20:2, 10), a permissive will of God, who overrules all things (Rom. 9:16; 1 Cor. 10:10; 2 Cor. 4:4; 22:31-32); that had he who was reserved and abiding in trespasses, and therefore his final doom is certain (John 10:23; 13:27; 14:1; 1 Pet. 5:8; Rev. 20:10). But he can only resist and overcome him only in the armor of God, namely by the blood of the Lamb (Rev. 5:6; 12:10; 16:18; Rev. 12:11).

9. We believe in THE SECOND COMING OF CHRIST

personal, visible, and glorious—a blessed hope for which we daily pray, the time being unrevealed but always imminent (Act. 1:11; ACTS 1:11; REV. 1:7; MARK 13:33; TITUS 2:11-13; REV. 22:20); that at His coming He will descend with His judgments and execute judgment and translation remove from the earth His waiting church (1 Thess. 4:16-18), then pour out the righteous judgments of God upon the unbelieving world (Rev. 6:1-18:24), afterward descend with His church and establish His glorious and eternal kingdom over all the nations for a thousand years (Rev. 10:1; 20:6; Matt. 13: 11, 13); that He will raise up the dead (Rev. 20:11-15) and finally reign the Son of man in deliverance, kingdom to come, and glory, forever with the Father in the new heaven and the new earth (Rev. 21:1-22:5).

10. We believe in THE IMMEDIATE REBIRTH AT JUDGMENT

that the spirits of the saved are now in heaven, where they abide in joyful fellowship with Him until His second coming when their bodies shall be raised to glorified bodies (Phil. 3:20, 21; 1 Cor. 15:35-37; 1 John 3:2), at which time their works shall be brought before the judgment seat of Christ for the determination of reward, which may issue in infinite rewards, but not in the loss of the soul; and that the spirits of the ungodly are now under punishment until the final day of judgment (1 Tim. 5:10); that at that time their bodies shall be raised from the curse, though still sinners, to receive their works, and cast into the place of fire (Rev. 20:14-15; 2 Cor. 5:8; 1 Thess. 1:9-10; 1 Cor. 9:43-48; Jude 13).

11. We believe in THE END-TIME CHURCH: the invisible spiritual body of the Lord Jesus (Eph. 4:4; 5:25-32), which He began to build on the day of Pentecost (Matt. 16:18; Acts 2:47), and will complete at His second coming (1 Thess. 4:16-17); and unto which all true believers of the present age are being added immediately by the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 12:12-17 with 1:2); that all the various members of this church will be gathered together unto themselves together in local churches for worship, prayer, fellowship, teaching, united testimony, and the observance of the ordinances of Great Lord (1 Cor. 10:25; 1 Cor. 11:17; 1 Cor. 11:27-28), among which are the following: the baptism of believers by immersion in water, the laying on of hands (1 Cor. 12:14, 15; 1 Cor. 14:3), the washing of the saints feet (John 13:1-17), the Lord's Supper or love-feast (1 Cor. 10:17-22; 1 Cor. 11:18-26), the communion of the bread and cup (1 Cor. 11:27-28), and prayer and anointing for the sick.

12. We believe in SEPARATION FROM THE WORLD: that since our Christian citizenship is in heaven, we have no fellowship of God with the world, having no fellowship with its evil ways (1 Pet. 5:1; 1 Cor. 5:9-10; 2 Cor. 6:14-18; Rom. 12:2; 1 Cor. 5:1-5; 1 Cor. 6:12; 1 Cor. 15:31; 1 Thess. 5:17; 1 Cor. 6:18-20; 1 Cor. 10:26), from abstaining from all worldliness. Concerning which the Apostle Paul writes thus: “We have withdrawn ourselves from the carnal, worldly, fleshly life, from the world, and its ways” (Luke 2:14; 1 Thess. 5:21-22; 1 Cor. 6:12; 1 Cor. 15:31; 1 Thess. 5:17; 1 Cor. 6:18-20), from the sin of divorce and remarriage as forbidden by the Word of God, from oaths and oaths of any oath (James 5:12), from the sins of pride, covetousness, and the like, and from all uncleanness or lusts of the flesh (Col. 3:5-10; 1 Cor. 6:18-20; 1 Cor. 12:18-21; 2 Cor. 10:3-4).

We understand that the above articles do not give any creed, but only a summary of the creed which is the whole Word of God, and they are not intended to set it limit beyond which faith cannot go within this Word, but we do believe that in so far as these articles extend, they are a true presentation of the Word of God, and we therefore bindingly represent them as Christian followers.
